6. Principal Report – Ms. Wiebe

Current enrolment: 126 In school: 119

At home: 7 students

- 1) As of today, we have 119 students registered for next year. This is down about 7 kids from our current year. There are still a few families on the fence due to covid, and who knows what summer may bring?
- 2) Proposed Grade Level Configurations for Next Year:

Kindergarten - Mrs. Kiers (enrolment currently at 16)

- 1 / 2 Mrs. Jensen (25)
- 3 / 4 Ms. Williams (24)

4 / 5 Ms Chornopyski (27)

6 - 9 Mrs. Webster (30)

6 - 9 Mr Seely

Mrs Kiers has been moved to full time, so she will be supporting grades 1-3 Mrs Wiebe and Mr Seely will be supporting the 4 / 5 group

*** increased enrolment may lead to changes.

Goal is to create more opportunities for smaller groups so ALL kids are getting the support they need. EA support will be sorted out soon, but I have not reduced EAs.

- This year we were granted the gift of covid money, so we were able to keep classes smaller. There are some strange little blips in our numbers, particularly in grades 2, 3 and in grades 6-9. This makes it hard for stand alone classes, and pulls total funding down.

- Proposing a 7-9 combined class would have been sudden death for our numbers.

- Good news is that we have had strong enrollment in Kindergarten for two years in a row. We will continue strengthening our programming to grow this. I have earmarked some money for increased SLP supports in K-3. Mrs. Kiers brings a robust knowledge base to our Kindergarten and primary grades to support literacy and numeracy development.

- We also have some larger numbers heading to junior high in the next few years. The junior high team and myself are looking at ways to make our junior high an attractive place for kids to be. I will be pursuing community connections to build increased learning options and sports opportunities.

Long term goals: Increased academics K-6 and robust junior high planning to keep kids in our school from K-9.
3) Pinnacle: Pinnacle has generously donated \$5000 to our school! We are beyond grateful. We will use this money to beef up the library and purchase cooking equipment for our upgraded foods lab.

4) At-home learning is a bit smoother this time. As per Alberta Education's mandate, there are a few students who require specialized programs and support coming into the school in the morning.
