If a student's attendance drops below 85%, school administration will contact parents and/or guardians to solve the problem. If the problem remains unresolved, the issue will be referred to Parkland School Division.

If you are planning a family vacation during scheduled school days, please discuss the absence with the homeroom teacher as soon as possible to ensure your child will not be missing critical assessments or work. This gives your teacher time to make alternate arrangements.

Students in junior high are permitted to leave school property at the start of lunch recess (11:37 a.m) if signed consent has been turned into the office. Leaving school during the school day is a privilege, and not a right. School administration has the right to remove and/or suspend these privileges, as required, or if students return to school late on more than two occasions.

Riding the Bus

Students are expected to follow all rules set out by PSD Transportation and their bus driver. These are set in place to ensure that the bus is a safe environment.

Students must have a current bus pass and be prepared to scan this card before getting on the bus and once they depart the bus every day.

Parents <u>must</u> notify their bus driver and the school office if their children will not be going home on the bus in the afternoon.

If communication is unclear regarding transportation changes, your child will be sent home on his or her regular bus.

Parkland School Division Code of Conduct

In Parkland School Division, all members of our school community are expected to promote and demonstrate respect, civility, and responsible citizenship. With these goals in mind, everyone must:

- Demonstrate honesty and integrity
- Respect differences in people, their ideas and their opinions
- Acknowledge the right of everyone to be treated with dignity, at all times
- Take appropriate measures to help those in need
- Use non-violent means to resolve conflict
- Honour the role(s) of persons in positions of authority
- Show care and regard for school property and the property of others
- Comply with all applicable federal, provincial and municipal laws

In Parkland School Division, we are all models for the kinds of citizens we desire to be. We teach and learn by example.

School Expectations and Discipline

We value the strength of the relationships we form with our families and with our students. If you have any concerns about your child, please address this with your child's teacher first. If the concern is not resolved, a meeting with the principal will be scheduled to help find a solution.

There are three expectations for Entwistle students and staff:

- 1) Respect yourself and others.
- 2) Engage in productive work.
- 3) Maintain a safe, clean environment.

Teaching, modeling and reinforcing clear behavioral expectations, providing supports and interventions for students with challenging behaviors, and using alternatives to suspension or expulsion are effective forms of positive student discipline and preferred, wherever possible. Students who continue to experience difficulty meeting school expectations will be disciplined according to PSD Administrative Procedure 360: <u>Student Discipline</u>.

Electronic Devices and Cell Phones

Classroom teachers decide how electronic devices will be used in their classrooms. Students are expected to comply with the conditions for learning in their classrooms. Students are encouraged to use electronic devices as they relate to the Code of Conduct and Technology Agreement on student registration forms.

Can a staff member confiscate my electronic device(s)?

Yes. Improper use or violations of technology use agreements may lead to the confiscation of electronic devices by the teacher until the end of the day. If the misuse is of a serious nature, parents will be notified and it could lead to the loss of technology use for an extended period of time or the remainder of the school year. Students are asked to demonstrate responsible digital citizenship and use technology for its intended purpose: to enhance learning.

Cell Phone Use

Cell phones can prove to be very disruptive to the learning environment and their use will not be permitted in the classroom. The classroom teacher may use their discretion and permit cell phone usage on occasion.

Students in Kindergarten to Grade 6 are not permitted to use cell phones during recess breaks.

No cell phones are permitted in washrooms or the gym and gym change rooms.

Junior high students may check their phones during recess breaks, and they may take their cell phones with them if they leave school property during lunch recess. Phones must be put away when they return to school. Inappropriate use of cell phones at school will result in communications with parents, and phones will be securely kept in the office until the end of the school day.

Students have access to a phone in the office if they need to contact their parents/guardians, and parents/guardians can call the school if they need to speak with their children.

Please be advised that you bring your devices at your own risk. The school does not assume responsibility if they are lost or stolen. Learning will not be interrupted to solve the problem of a missing device.

Can students access Wi-Fi at Entwistle School?

Yes. Students will be provided with a PSD Wi-Fi password for devices for learning purposes.



Recess and Noon Hour Policy

Students will play outside at recesses and at lunch recess unless temperatures drop below -23 with the windchill.

Recess times may also be modified due to a number of other factors including air quality, high humidex, extreme heat, etc. Please see *weather* <u>AP 750</u> for more details.

We allow our Grades 7 through 9 students to leave the property for lunch recess with signed parental permission. When the weather outside is very poor, we may announce that everyone stays inside.

Please ensure students are suitably dressed for the prevailing weather conditions.

Dress Code

Students will be asked to alter or change their clothing if it is deemed inappropriate or disrespectful in any way. Parents will be notified if an issue persists.

Please note the following:

- Appropriate school clothing means that it is:
 - Effective for the learning task
 - o Gym apparel is suggested for students in grades 4-9
 - o Footwear must match the activity
 - Not harmful in message: messages printed on clothing are in good taste (alcohol/drug related, profanity, violence, and sexually inappropriate are not allowed).
 - For the purpose of student safety, staff members must be able to make eye contact with students at any time. Sunglasses, hoods and hats that obstruct eye contact are not permitted.
 - Outdoor clothing must reflect weather conditions. In winter, you must have warm boots, jackets, mitts and something to cover your head. You are asked to wear footwear appropriate to the weather conditions.

For health and safety reasons students MUST wear indoor shoes at all times at school.

O' Canada

Parkland School Division's Patriotic Exercises Administrative Procedure 267 states that O' Canada will be played in all schools on a consistent weekly schedule. Notwithstanding individual classroom conditions for learning, hats and hoodies must be removed during the National Anthem. Our Land Acknowledgement will also be read during this time.

Physical Education

All students require clean gym shoes (with non-marking soles) to be worn in the gymnasium. Specific activities such as skating and snowshoeing would require special clothing that would be requested by the physical education teacher as necessary.

School Photographs

School, classroom and individual photographs are scheduled to take place each year. Prior notification will be sent home.

Lockers & Locks

There is no fee for using a school lock or locker. Locks from home are not permitted and will be removed. Students are expected to keep their lockers clean and in good condition. Periodic locker checks may take place throughout the school year. Locker access is restricted to regular recess and break times. As per Parkland School Division's "Drug Free Protocol", a Locker License Agreement form must be signed by parent and student before a locker will be issued. The school lock must be returned at the end of the year or a fee to replace the lock may be charged.

Yearly Awards

Every year in June we hold an awards assembly to recognize some of the great accomplishments of our students. Awards that students may receive include:

Melnyk/Bullock Literacy Award - This award goes to a Grade One, Grade Two and Grade Three student who have demonstrated the most improvement in reading throughout the school year.

Fine Arts Award - Awarded to ECS-Grade 9 for excellence in any of the Fine Arts: Music, Art or Drama.

Melnyk/Bullock Citizenship Award - Recipient must portray an attitude of responsible citizenship. Characteristics include, but are not limited to: a willingness to work collaboratively and/or independently on projects that benefit the school/community; empathy and compassion for others; kindness, fairness; leadership skills; the ability to exercise self-control; integrity in interactions with others.

Merit Awards - Recipients of this award meet the following requirements: work to the best of his/her ability; display a high level of courtesy towards students, staff and visitors; and cooperate with other students and staff.

Academic Achievement - This award is presented to one student in each of grades 4 to 6 who has achieved the highest academic results. For grades 7 to 9, we may present this award to one student in each grade level or we may present the award for the highest academic achievement in the cohort.

Diamond Award - This award is presented to one student who best demonstrates, through word and deed, the virtues that are cherished in the Entwistle community and also includes active involvement in school life, is dedicated, reliable and exhibits a strong, consistent work ethic.

Assemblies and Events

Assemblies will be held towards the end of each month and the dates will be included on our public calendar. At assemblies, selected students will be recognized for demonstrating excellence beyond classroom work. We will also recognize members of our community who have made significant impacts to our school community. Parents, friends, relatives and members of the community are welcome and encouraged to attend.
