Jan 18, 2022 Board Meeting

• The Board received as information the Parkland School Division Attendance Area Review. (https://www.psd.ca/download/378346) On January 12, 2021, the Board of Trustees directed administration to conduct an attendance area review of all schools in Parkland School Division (PSD) in order to facilitate long-term planning and the effective use of our school facilities. Administration engaged external consultants from Edmonton Public Schools, Infrastructure Planning to conduct the attendance review and to produce a report with

recommendations. The report will be the first phase in the attendance review. The second phase will consist of public engagement on the recommendations and the third phase will be a final decision by the Board and implementation. It is anticipated that implementation of any changes in attendance areas approved by the Board would take place September, 2023.

- The Board welcomed a virtual delegation from the Remuda Horsemanship Program. Remuda Horsemanship is an equine assisted social skill development program in which students are encouraged to develop prosocial skills through interaction with horses. Schools involved in Equestrian Outdoor learning include: Connections for Learning, Spruce Grove Composite High School, Blueberry School and Wabamun Schools.
- The Board directed administration to establish a submission deadline for schools to nominate a first-year teacher for the Alberta School Boards Association Edwin Parr Award as March 4, 2022; and subsequently named Trustees Cameron, Hennig and Wagner, as members of the Edwin Parr Selection Committee.
- The Board received as information the Quarterly Financial Report (https://www.psd.ca/download/378347) for the period ending November 30, 2021. As of November 30, 2021, revenues year to date were \$34.1M and expenditures year to date were \$32.3M resulting in a surplus of \$1.8M. A deficit of \$1.5M is currently forecast for the year ended August 31, 2022 compared to the budget of a deficit of \$2.0M. The change in the forecasted deficit is primarily the result of \$1.6M of COVID-19 Mitigation funding and additional weighted moving average funding offset by additional staffing and expenses due to 327 additional students over budget.

- o Recommendation G Address Forest Green School's future capacity by monitoring enrolment and adding 1-2 modular units if warranted.
- o Recommendation J Move senior high French Immersion from Spruce Grove Composite High School to Memorial Composite High School in Stony Plain addressing both over capacity at SGCHS and transportation challenges busing students from PSD's west end for high school French Immersion.
- O Recommendation K Address future growth areas in East Spruce Grove.
- o Recommendation L Address future growth challenges in developing areas of West Spruce Grove.
- Recommendation M Address future growth challenges in developing areas of Stony Plain.
