Fee increases are required to operate the Division's regional transportation system on a break-even basis. Increases are being proposed to offset Transportation Service's anticipated increases in fuel, carbon tax and contractor rates due to inflation and Insurance.

Increases are based on three principles that previous Board members had set.

- 1. The Transportation department will operate within the funding envelope.
- 2. Current service levels will be maintained.
- 3. Rural and Urban fees will move towards being equal and reflect the cost of the service provided to riders

The Outcome:

Ineligible rural rider fee increase is larger at 16% (\$70) Other rider fee increases range from 5%-10% (\$5-\$50)

The Good News:

All other fees - Tuition, specific programming etc. remain the same with zero increase.

1) Covid:
